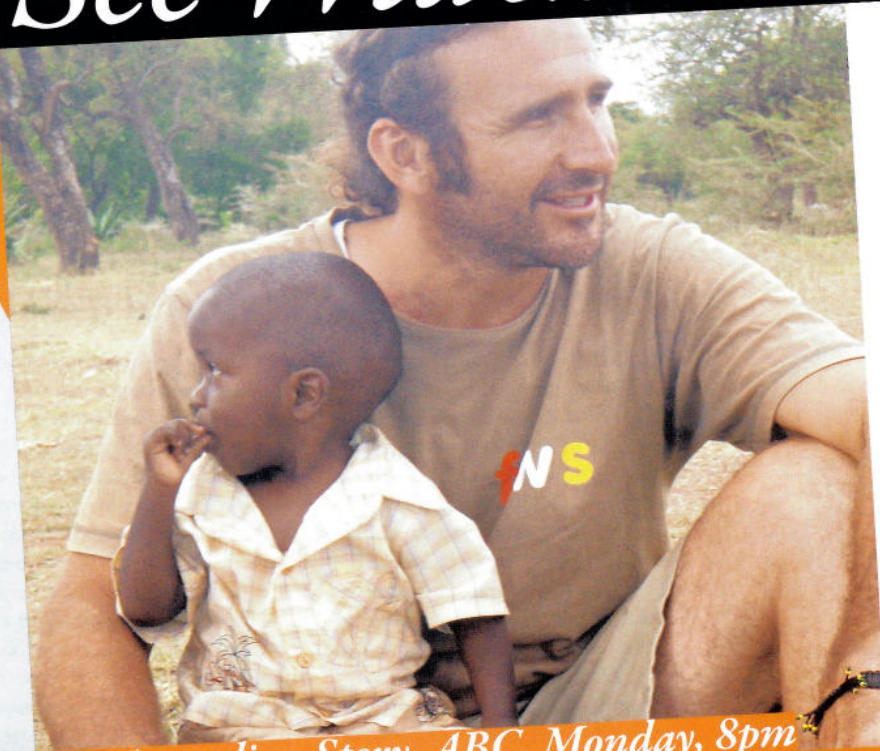

FILM

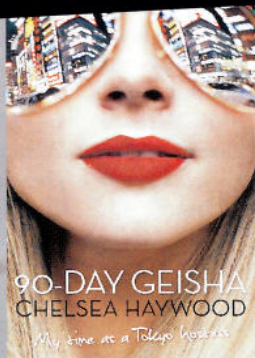
The Duchess
